COVID-19 Astra Zeneca vaccine side effects

You may experience minor side effects following your vaccination against COVID-19. Most side effects last no more than a couple of days and you should recover without any problems.

Common side effects of this vaccine include:

- tenderness, pain, warmth, redness, itching or swelling at the injection site
- feeling unwell
- tiredness
- chills, fever or feeling feverish
- headache
- nausea
- muscle aches or pain
- joint pain

Paracetamol can be taken if you need relief from pain or fever.

Rare but serious side effects of this vaccine include:

- · rash, itching or hives on the skin
- swelling of the face, lips, tongue or other parts of the body
- shortness of breath, wheezing or difficulty breathing
- fainting, dizziness, feeling lightheaded (due to a drop in blood pressure)

Contact your doctor immediately or go straight to the emergency department at your nearest hospital if you notice any of these RARE BUT SERIOUS side effects.

<u>ALL</u> side effects <u>MUST</u> be reported no matter how mild they may appear. If you are having side effects during your post vaccination observation period, please notify us prior to leaving.

If you experience common/mild side effects after leaving, please go online and report them directly to the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) at tga.gov.au/reporting-problems OR phone 1300 134 237 (8am – 8pm 7 days/wk).
